- 3. Read the fragment and answer the questions that follow. (Marks: 1+2+2+5=10) "They looked at him so long and so closely that Pelayo and Elisenda very soon overcame their surprise and in the end found him familiar."

- iv. Who is Elisenda? What kind of a person is she? Who does she represent?
- v. Please talk about the techniques that the author has used that make this text unique and magic realist in nature. How is it different from any 'fantasy' story? Why or why not did you find this story of interest?
