- 2. Did radio play any role in the politics of the Unites States in 1920s?
- 3. Write a brief note on the developments in the information and communication sector in India in the first half of eighties.
- 4. The Supreme Court in a landmark judgement in 1995 held that airwaves or frequencies are public properties. Comment.
- Write a critical note on the Indian Telegraph Act 1885 which was conceived at the time when India was still under British.

SECTION: B

(Attempt any two questions. Each question carries 10 marks. (400-500 words each)

- 1. Explain the argument by Benedict Anderson that nation-states were formed around their 'national print language'...
- 2. Write a note on media technologies, the context in which they evolve and possible relationship with forces of social change.
- In the post cold war era, media technologies have been used as weapons during war times. Comment.

SECTION: C

Attempt only one question. The question carries 15 marks. (600 words minimum)

- 1. Media policy is the rules and regulation in a given media system of a country. Discuss this in the context of different forms of governance and ideologies around the world.
