[1] Department of Science and Technology (DST), Ministry of Science and Technology (Government of India) approved the grant of nearly Rs. 6.0 Crore on 3rd of August 2023 for establishing very first PURSE lab for the state of Uttarakhand in Doon University. Hon'ble Chancellor has already taken the cognizance of this fact. In appreciation of the R&D contributions of the performing universities, PURSE initiative is taken by Department of Science & Technology, Government of India to initiate value added proactive measures through introduction of R&D Incentive Grant. PURSE scheme provides substantive research grant to universities on based on scientific publications in Science Citation Indexed Journals through SCOPUS Database.

SCOPUS incorporates the H-Index as a means to evaluate research performance. The H-index attempts to measures both the scientific productivity and the apparent scientific impact of a researcher. The index is based on the set of the researcher's most cited papers and the numbers of citation that they have received in other people's publication. The H-Index can also be applied to judge the impact and productivity of a group of researchers at a department or university.

[2] Doon University signed an MoU with International Center for AI and Cyber Security Research and Innovation Asia University CCRIAU, Taiwan for enhancement of academic and research collaboration between the two institutes on Aug 10, 2023. It is another significant milestone in the academic field of AI and Cyber Security. This MoU will be highly beneficial for the students and research scholars of Doon University. It will facilitate enhancing the cooperation between the two institutes in the field of artificial intelligence, cyber security, machine learning, internet of things, computer vision, health care, mobile security, cloud security, and adversarial machine learning.

In the MoU signing ceremony, CCRI Asia University, Taiwan Director Professor Brij B. Gupta was present in Doon University. Doon University is the first university in this state where International Conference in cyber security and AI domain will be organized in collaboration with Asia University Taiwan in the coming year. Students can apply for many fellowships to pursue research internship program and student exchange in Taiwan such as Taiwan International Internship Program (IIP) Fellowship, Taiwan Experience Education Program (TEEP) Fellowship, and Asia University Research funding. Faculty exchange program is also being provisioned under this MoU whereby the faculty of Doon University will be able to go to Asia University Taiwan and the faculty there will come for teaching in Doon University. The collaboration will be able to give multifarious results from which the students will be benefited. Advance Cyber Security Research Lab in Department of Computer Science, Doon University, has been established with a purpose to train the students in cyber security. This MoU will also facilitate the students pursuing cyber security and AI projects in their respective B.Sc (Computer Science) / B.Tech/ MTech/ Ph.D (Computer Science and Engineering) programme, to avail research internships opportunities to study in Taiwan's university for 3 to 6 months. In addition, under this MoU, cooperation and participation can be ensured in organizing workshops, national and international seminars and international conferences on topics of common interest related to cyber security and artificial intelligence.

[3] Doon University has signed MoU with Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER) Pune on 29th August 2023. This MoU will pave the way and enable Doon University to carry out extension activities to support school-teachers of the state of Uttarakhand through iRISE (Inspiring India in Research Innovation and STEM Education) program (a joint and collaborative programme between the Department of Science & Technology, IISER Pune, British Council, Royal Society of Chemistry, and Tata Technologies). The programme supports the Government of India's

objective of building a nurturing ecosystem that promotes research and innovation in schools and universities by enriching DST's flagship program INSPIRE and INSPIRE Awards - MANAK. In addition, the programme provides a platform for industry and academic leaders to come together and strengthen innovation in India.

Under the Teachers' Development strand of the iRISE, so far IISER Pune has collaborated with the Central Board for Secondary Education (CBSE), Delhi, State Council for Education, Research and Training (SCERT), Maharashtra, and Bihar Education Project Council, Bihar to train secondary school teachers in inquiry and activity-based learning for STEM subjects.



Doon University ready to offer a favorable environment for civil service aspirants

Under the directive of Hon'ble Governor Lt. Gen. Shri Gurmeet Singh, the Super-39 Coaching Center aimed at preparing candidates for civil services examinations will start functioning in Doon University from the month of October. In the series, an orientation program was organized for prospective students on 25 August 2023 in Doon University.

During the workshop address, Professor Surekha Dangwal, the Vice Chancellor of Doon University, emphasized that the Doon University's center will provide guidance not only to its own students but also to others aiming to prepare for Civil Services Examinations or pursue a career in Civil Services. National Counselling Psychology Day celebrated in Doon University

Dehradun, Aug 17, 2023: Underlying the significance global relevance of the discipline of Psychology and mental health post Covid 19, the Doon University celebrated National Counselling Day today organized a series of awareness programmes attended by over 100 young psychologists.

Vice-Chancellor Prof. Surekha Dangwal said that there is an urgent need to run an awareness campaign related to psychology among the common people as in society there is still a sense of stigma attached to the persons with psychological problems.

"It is because of this perception of stigma and shame that people hide psychological problems and the issues take a formidable form. People suffer in silence while there is an urgent need to consult a psychiatrist or admit such persons in a hospital," Professor Dangwal said adding that many psychological problems can be managed at an early stage if adequate care is taken and psychological counselling is conducted at the right time.

"Appointing a counsellor in every school is the need of the hour today. There are ample career opportunities and that is why there is a lot of craze among the students regarding the subject of psychology. As a result, there is a competition between the students taking psychology subject at Masters and Graduation level in Doon University and all the seats are filled up," Prof. Dangwal said.

The main speaker in this program, Dr. Pawan Sharma emphasized the importance of training the brain in the right way. "Brain works on programming and that is why it is very important to pay attention to programming," Dr. Sharma said.

Dr. Savita Karnataka, Chairperson of the Department of Psychology, said that training is very important in the field of counselling and that is why the Department keeps organizing training programs for the students.

In his address, Dr. Rajesh Bhatt said that National Counselling Psychology Day is celebrated every year on August 17 by the Indian Counselling Psychology Organization so that awareness can be spread among people on the significance of counselling.
