




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

The Lottery (Book Review)


"The lottery" is a captivating short story that delvs into the dark part of society of a seemingly innocent tradition.

Ichigo Ichie is a Japanese proverb , that has its origin from the Sadō/Chadō (tea ceremony) of Japan. It was first used at one of such ceremonies by Sen no Rikyu, a tea ceremony master ,back in time. Where Ichigo Ichie can simply be translated as "One time, one encounter "It holds profound meaning deep within. It refers to the meetings or the opportunities that one may encounter once in a lifetime , that is since one's birth to one's demise and that, these won't be repeating ever again. And the time Sen no Rikyu was active in the ceremonies was that of wars , so it had even more significant meaning to people back then as the meetings then were not promised, and hence the proverb was frequently used in the Sadō to show sincere hospitality to the guests and to make 'em realise the importance of their being.

Aside from that Ichigo Ichie signifies that one should live each passing moment to the fullest and always value the meetings one is part of, for it may be the last, even if it isn't, the next meeting won't ever be the same, for the moments that have passed can never come back and the moments that are to come are not in one's control so what one needs, is to focus on present, to live the memories rather than crying over 'em or planning 'em.

INTERVIEW WITH DR ANIL RATURI

For this interview, we had the former DGP of Uttarakhand,Dr. Anil Raturi with us. He is an avid reader and literature enthusiast. In this interview, he talks about his book, "Bhanwar: Ek Prem Kahani" and also about his experience with the Elysian Literary Society of Doon University.

- You have shown great talent in writing, evident from your work on "Bhanwar: Ek Prem Kahani". As this magazine is aimed towards literature students, do you have any advice for the young and aspiring writers who will be reading this publication?



I want to share that my book, Bhawar: Ek Prem Kahani, has been published by Winsar Publishing Co. Dehradun and is available on Amazon. It is written in Hindi. While I wouldn't call myself a great writer, I have managed to write a book. As this magazine is focused on literature, my advice to aspiring writers would be to read as much as possible. Reading exposes you to a wealth of knowledge that has been accumulated over thousands of years, and with the advent of social media, this knowledge is more accessible than ever. The more you read, the more you can understand and appreciate the works of great authors, thinkers, and philosophers from all genres, be it sociology, economics, psychology, science, or physics. This knowledge forms a melting pot in your mind, stimulating your creativity and helping you to come up with original ideas and emotions. Observing the world around you, including nature, people, and everyday life, is also crucial to becoming a successful writer. This keen observation and acquired knowledge can then be articulated through writing, whether it be a diary, journal, articles, or essays. Once you have honed your thoughts and ideas into a cohesive message, you are ready to write a book.

- How did you begin writing?


I wrote a book in 2021, but the idea had been brewing since 2012 when I attended a training in London. With a few days to spare before my flight back to India, I settled into my five-star hotel and started writing. However, once I returned to work, it was difficult to find time to continue. Despite this, the book stayed with me, and when I retired in 2020, I finally had the chance to finish it. With the second wave of COVID-19 hitting in 2021, I completed the book in three months and got it published. Though the process began in 2012, writing is a lifelong journey that starts at birth, shaped by our observations and experiences. It helps us articulate our thoughts in the language we've learned, be it English or Hindi. Overall, the journey of writing this book was beautiful, and the process of writing was wonderful.

- Regarding your book "Bhanvar: Ek Prem Kahani", you were a guest speaker at our university. You were invited by Prof. Surekha Dangwal, the Honorable Vice Chancellor, and Dr. Chetana Pokhriyal, the Head of Department, to participate in a book discussion event organized by the Elysian Literary Society of Doon University. Would you like to share any feedback or comments for our Literary Society?

I think Elysian is a wonderful initiative of the Department of English of Doon University, Dehradun. I was there to be part of one of the literary discussions on my book and I had a very scintillating session. In fact, the students wanted the session to continue longer as they were very excited and had a lot of questions. The session was meant to be just an hour long but it went on for around two and a half hours. Firstly, I found that the students were very enthusiastic and intelligent. Their articulate manner was indicative of their inclination to their subject of literature. As far as Elysian is concerned, the word itself is quite appropriate as the ultimate aspect of human existence that makes you experience bliss is literature. The word Elysian stems from Greek mythology or rather from the Greek concept of Elysium, a heavenly place where the greatest of warriors were rewarded with ultimate bliss. Here, I would say that it is very appropriate that literature creates bliss when you read, discuss or write it. So Elysian is a wonderful nomenclature picked up by the Literary Society and I have had a wonderful first-hand experience. I want to congratulate the entire university and everyone who is a part of it.

- Thank you for your kind words, sir. We look forward to seeing you here again. I would like to ask if you have any final words for our readers.

I presume that your magazine would be read by most of the students, the faculty, people visiting your university, and an online audience. I would say that you are very lucky to be getting this opportunity to read this wonderful magazine. - What inspired you to a career in criminal justice?

I told you that as a student of literature during my study in Delhi, I happened to see this movie called "Ardhasatya" in which Om Puri is a police officer. Who is very, very dedicated to justice. And so I was inspired by that character and even though when I passed the civil service examination I had the option of joining the Indian Foreign Service. But I wanted to serve people at the grassroots. Because in the police you have executive powers to help people immediately. So I think it is one of the most effective departments to help people.

- Sir how do we, as students, help and serve our nation with our limited resources?

That's a very good question. Students are the future leaders of our society. And people like you, who are studying in a good university. Are a very, very small minority who have this privilege, to go to such a good place to study. And in the next few years, all of you will be in some positions of responsibility. And therefore it means you will be leading. India is a very rich land. Nature has endowed India to become a very rich country. But because we have not been able to organize ourselves, we are one of the poorest countries. Now, what is the problem? Leaders! Leaders like you! You should organize the country better. And take India to the destiny of becoming what it is capable of. You are very lucky that you were born at the time when in the next 15-20 years India will be one of the leading countries of the world. One of the best times for India is coming now. Now, it is going to come in 15-20 years and at that time you will all be at the head of leadership, somewhere in different places. So what can you do? You should become competent through good study, hard work, and discipline. You may be very intelligent, and very talented, but if you have no discipline you will be zero. So you should work hard, improve your competence, become disciplined, and most importantly make sure the energy is there. But that energy should not go in the wrong direction, it should go constructively. It should go into something constructive. And you should be honest. You should not fraud anybody. Character, honesty, hard work, good habits, exercise, physical fitness, mental alertness, mental hard work, physical hard work, and no drugs! This can only happen with discipline.

- Sir, when you see the current state of Uttarakhand, what changes do the people want from the police department and what changes does the police department want from the people?

It is a very important point and Uttarakhand police works very hard. But there is always a scope for improvement. There is a lot of scope for improvement in the services of the police. The people should also be law-abiding. The people should try to follow the law. If you ride a scooter or a motorcycle, you should wear a helmet. You must follow the speed limit. You should carry all the documents. And you should not drive when you are drunk. You should not drink and then drive. And you should always see that for your safety and others' safety as well. As far as crime, we should always help the police to detect the crime. To ensure that people who commit crimes are punished by law. Society can always contribute to that. Society should be peaceful. They should not create unnecessary strife in the society. Especially based on various small issues for all castes, communities, races, languages, and religions. We are one country. India has people from all parts of the world! And we are living so peacefully. So if you continue to maintain peace then we will be very famous, we are already a very famous tourist destination and we will develop. And when you will develop then the income of the people will increase, and when the income of the people increases, the quality of life of the people will increase. Everybody will progress.


Deforestation can be reduced by promoting lesser use of raw material from the forest. We can bring a change to our forests by growing trees and small plants.

Force Femme Fierce

Chandrayaan-3 is a follow-on mission to Chandrayaan-2. It demonstrated end-to-end capability in safe landing and roving on the lunar surface. It's main objective was to do "Soft landing on the moon's surface". It consisted of Lander and Rover configuration. It was launched by LVM3 from SDSC SHAR, Sriharikota. The propulsion module carried the lander and rover configuration till 100 km lunar orbit. On August 26, Prime Minister Narendra Modi met with several female scientists from the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) to highlight the role women played in Chandrayaan-3 lunar mission. The women scientists of this mission played a crucial role in ensuring its success. Without their contribution, this achievement was just not possible. PM Modi also decided to name Chandrayaan-3's landing spot on the moon "Shiv Shakti", a name derived from the concept of feminine energy in Hindu mythology, and a tribute to the women scientists who worked on the mission.

ISRO chief S. Somanath talked about how women were involved in conceptualizing, designing and executing the Chandrayaan-3 mission. Some of them played a significant role in navigation during the lander's critical descent. Reema Ghosh is a robotics specialist who worked on the development of the "Pragyan" rover that is currently operating on the lunar surface. "For me, Pragyan is like the baby and he is taking baby steps on the moon. It is a wonderful experience to see the rover roll out on the moon for the first time," Ghosh told the press following Modi's visit. Ritu Karidhal, popularly known as the "rocket woman" of India is a senior scientist and aerospace engineer who joined ISRO in 1997 and has been part of many important space missions, including Chandrayaan-2, for which Karidhal also received the "ISRO Young Scientist Award.

Another ISRO senior scientist, Nidhi Porwal, who also worked diligently for four years to ensure the success of Chandrayaan-3, described the lander

reaching the lunar surface as "magic". She said that the contribution of women at ISRO sets a strong example for other fields. Despite ISRO's record of including women scientists, experts believe that more needs to be done to increase the participation of women in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) programs. "It is worth mentioning that every drop counts because it has some value, some additive effect. However, it should certainly be the goal for every scientific and technological endeavor in the country to see that women's participation is not increasing dropwise but by leaps and bounds.

We are way behind that goal," Vineeta Bal, a biologist, told DW. Bal, a former member of the Prime Minister's task force for women in science under the Ministry of Science and Technology, said India needs a higher representation of women in these disciplines.
