- iv. Which event, is Miss Havisham obsessed with, from the past?

- ii. In Great Expectations, why does Joe put up with Mrs. Joe's abuse? Do you agree with his choice. Does he do enough to protect Pip?
- iii. Write a character sketch of Angel Clare from Tess of the d'Urbervilles.
- iv. Annotate the following line with reference to context: My life might have been passed in ease and luxury; but I preferred glory to every enticement that wealth placed in my path.
- Q. 3. Write notes, on any two of the following, in about 750-1000 words each: (4x5=20)
  - Frankenstein is four stories in one: an allegory, a fable, an epistolary novel, and an autobiography.

  - iii. Between Pip's various "educators" on his path to becoming a gentleman—including Mr. Wopsle, Biddy, Estella, Herbert, and Matthew Pocket—how does Pip's educational process change over the course of the novel? How does Pip's idea of a "gentleman" evolve with his teachings?
  - iv. Write a note on the main themes of the novel Persuasion.
  - v. Do you think Tess emerges as a powerful character in Tess of the d'Urbervilles? Justify briefly.
