THE CONSTITUTION (ELEVENTH AMENDMENT) ACT, 1961

[19th December, 1961.]

An Act further to amend the Constitution of India.

BE it enacted by Parliament in the Twelfth Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

1. Short title.-This Act may be called the Constitution (Eleventh Amendment) Act, 1961.

- (2) Amendment of article 66.-In article 66 of the Constitution, (1),"members of clause the words of both Houses Parliament assembled joint meeting", the words "members of an electoral at a college consisting of the members of both Houses of Parliament" shall be substituted.
- 3. Amendment of article 71.-In article 71 of the Constitution, after clause (3), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-
- "(4) The election of a person as President or Vice-President be called in question on the ground of the existence of any vacancy for whatever reason among the members of the electoral college electing him.".
