## STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

THE CONSTITUTION (TWENTY-THIRD AMENDMENT) ACT, 1969

[23rd January, 1970.]

An Act further to amend the Constitution of India.

BE it enacted by Parliament in the Twentieth Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

- 1. Short title.-This Act may be called the Constitution (Twenty-third Amendment) Act, 1969.
- Amendment article 330.-In article 330 of the Constitution, of sub-clause clause for "except (b) of (1),the words the Scheduled Assam", Tribes tribal areas of the "except the Scheduled in the words **Tribes** in tribal the areas of Assam and Nagaland" shall substituted.
- 3. Amendment of article 332.-In article 332 of the Constitution, in the (1),for the words "except Scheduled Tribes in the tribal Assam", the words "except the Scheduled Tribes areas in the tribal areas of Assam and in Nagaland" shall be substituted.
- Amendment of article 333.-(1) In article 333 of the Constitution. for the words "nominate such number of members of the community to the he considers appropriate", the words "nominate one member as of that community to the Assembly" shall be substituted.
- (1) (2) Nothing contained in sub-section shall affect any community of Anglo-Indian Legislative representation the in the any State existing at the commencement of this Assembly of Act until the dissolution of that Assembly.
- 5. Amendment of article 334.-In article 334 of the Constitution, for years", "thirty the words "twenty the words years" shall be substituted.
