THE CONSTITUTION (TWENTY-FIFTH AMENDMENT) ACT, 1971

[20th April, 1972.]

An Act further to amend the Constitution of India.

BE it enacted by Parliament in the Twenty-second Year of the Republic of India as follow:-

- 1. Short title.-This Act may be called the Constitution (Twenty-fifth Amendment) Act, 1971.
- 2. Amendment of article 31.-In article 31 of the Constitution,-
- (a) for clause (2), the following clause shall be substituted, namely:-
- "(2)No property shall be compulsorily acquired or requisitioned save for a public purpose and save by authority of a law which provides for acquisition or requisitioning of the property for an amount which may fixed such law or which may be determined in accordance with by given in such such principles and manner as may be specified in such shall be called in question law; and no such law in any court on the ground that the amount so fixed or determined is not adequate that the whole or any part of such amount is to be given otherwise than in cash:

Provided that making law providing for the compulsory in any of established acquisition of any property an educational institution clause and administered by a minority, referred to in (1) of article 30. the State shall ensure that the amount fixed determined by or under such law for the acquisition of such property is such would as not restrict or abrogate the right guaranteed under that clause.";

- (b) after clause (2A), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-
- "(2B) Nothing in sub-clause (f) of clause (1) of article 19 shall affect any such law as is referred to in clause (2).".
- 3. Insertion of new article 31C.-After article 31B of the Constitution, the following article shall be inserted, namely:-

"31C.
