After the promulgation of the Government of Sikkim Act, the Chief Minister of Sikkim had made formal requests to the Government of India Chief Executive requesting the Government of India to take through the such steps as may be legally or constitutionally necessary to give Sikkim effect to the Government of Act. 1974 and the resolutions by the Assembly and particularly for providing for passed representation for the people of Sikkim in Parliament.

BE it enacted by Parliament in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

- 1. Short title and commencement.-(1) This Act may be called the Constitution (Thirty-fifth Amendment) Act, 1974.
- (2) It shall come into force on such date\_667 as the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint.
- 2. Insertion of new article 2A.-After article 2 of the Constitution, the following article shall be inserted, namely:-
- "2A. associated Union.-Sikkim, Sikkim to be with the which comprises the Tenth the territories specified in Schedule, shall be associated with the Union on the terms and conditions set out in that Schedule.".
- 3. Amendment ofarticle 80.-In article 80 of the Constitution. in words "The of States", clause (1),for the Council the words and figure "Subject the provisions of paragraph of the Tenth to Schedule, the Council of States" shall be substituted.
- 4. Amendment of article 81.-In article 81 of the Constitution, in clause (1).for the words and figures "Subject to the provisions of article 331", the words and figures "Subject to the provisions of article 331 and paragraph 4 of the Tenth Schedule" shall be substituted.
- 5. Addition of Tenth Schedule.-After the Ninth Schedule to the Constitution, the following Schedule shall be added, namely:-

**`TENTH SCHEDULE** 

[Articles 2A, 80(1) and 81(1)]

PART

TERRITORIES OF SIKKIM

1. Sikkim.---Sikkim comprises the following territories, namely:-

The territories which, immediately before the coming into force of the Government of Sikkim Act, 1974, were comprised in Sikkim.

## PART B

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ASSOCIATION OF SIKKIM WITH THE UNION

- 2. Responsibilities of the Government of India.-(1) The Government of India-
- (a) shall solely responsible for the defence and territorial be integrity of Sikkim and for the conduct and regulation of the external relations of Sikkim, whether political, economic or financial;
- exclusive constructing, (b) shall have the right of maintaining and the of aerodromes, regulating use railways, landing grounds air facilities, navigation posts, telegraphs, telephones and wireless installations in Sikkim:
- responsible securing (c) shall be for the economic and social development of Sikkim and for ensuring good administration and the maintenance of communal harmony therein;
- (d) shall responsible for providing facilities for students from Sikkim in institutions for higher learning in India and for the Sikkim public of employment of in the service India people from (including the All-India Services), with those available at par citizens of India;
- be (e) shall responsible for providing facilities for the participation and representation of the people of Sikkim in the political institutions of India.
- (2) The provisions contained in this paragraph shall not be enforceable by any court.
- 3. Exercise of certain powers by the President.-The President may, by general or special order, provide-
- (a) for the inclusion of the planned development of Sikkim within the ambit of the planning authority of India while that authority is preparing plans for the economic and social development India, and for appropriately associating officials from Sikkim in such work;
- (b) for the exercise of all or any of the powers vested or sought to be vested in the Government of India in or in relation to Sikkim under the Government of Sikkim Act, 1974.
- 4. Representation in Parliament.-Notwithstanding anything in this Constitution-

- (a) there shall be allotted to Sikkim one seat in the Council of States and one seat in the House of the People;
- (b) the representative of Sikkim in the Council of States shall be elected by the members of the Sikkim Assembly;
- representative of Sikkim in the House of the People chosen by direct election, and for this purpose, the whole of Sikkim shall form one parliamentary constituency be called to the parliamentary constituency for Sikkim:

- (iii) sub-clause (d) of clause (1) of article 102 shall apply as if the words "is not a citizen of India, or" had been omitted therefrom;
- (iv) article 103 shall not apply;

Explanation.-In this paragraph, the expression "the Sikkim Assembly" shall mean the Assembly for Sikkim constituted under the Government of Sikkim Act, 1974.
