THE CONSTITUTION (SIXTY-FOURTH AMENDMENT)

ACT, 1990

[16th April, 1990.]

An Act further to amend the Constitution of India.

BE it enacted by Parliament in the Forty-first Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

- 1. Short title.-This Act may be called the Constitution (Sixty-fourth Amendment) Act, 1990.
- 2. Amendment of article 356.-In article 356 of the Constitution,-
- (a) in clause (4), after the second proviso, the following proviso shall be inserted, namely:-

`Provided also the Proclamation issued that in the case of under clause (1) on the 11th day of May, 1987 with respect to the State of Punjab, the reference in the first proviso this clause to "three to vears" "three shall be construed reference and a six as to years months".';

(b) in clause (5), the following proviso shall be inserted at the end, namely:-

"Provided that nothing clause in this shall apply to the Proclamation issued under clause (1) on the 11th day of May, 1987 with respect to the State of Punjab.".
